

Montrose Campus to Expand

Colorado Mesa University at Montrose is growing, thanks to a recent campus expansion. The two-story, 3200 square-foot extension of the current CMU Montrose campus is located at 245 S. Cascade Avenue, just beyond the street from the existing academic center. Although the facility's current leaseholders. Edward D. Jones & Co... are to stay in one-third of the building, the university side remains private and accommodating for both students and staff.

The development will provide the campus with a secondarv meeting room, an area for student organizations to gather, and a student lounge that doubles as a tutoring area. It will also contain several

ter called the Montrose campus a "critical access point for students to earn a higher education in western Colorado," and stated

that partnerships with the City of Montrose and other vital contacts aided the university in procuring the building. He added that the acquisition is going to "dramatically boost" the university's efforts to serve its students.

Colorado Mesa University funded \$400,000 toward the acquisition, and an

additional \$50,000 was donated by the City of Montrose. "This is a great example of how CMU is CMU President Tim Fos- working with the City of Montrose and Montrose County, to expand CMU's campus in Montrose, and to better meet the needs of our students and of the region," stated

Dana Nunn, Colorado Mesa University spokesperson.

Facilities are to remain temporarily unavailable, while renovations occur.

Quizlet is an easy, simple and efficient way to store your flashcards to "quiz" yourself later. Simply go to www.quizlet.com, signup and start using! Here, you can search for vocab sets or make your own. You can even setup a classroom in order for classmates to join and share.

At Quizlet, you can test yourself, flip through flashcards, play scatter or race games and more. Over 900,000 students use quizlet each day, according to Andrew Sutherland, Quizlet's young founder.

I would like to congratulate those who responded to our public announcements this month, and are now one of seventy-five student members at Gold's Gym.

Associated Student Government (ASG) President Ariel Diamond states that CMU is committed "in providing our students with tools and facilities that develop a wellrounded life."

Throughout the summer, the ASG looked at ways to increase resources at the Montrose campus—specifically with student life. Fitness became a high focal point.

Due to the great success of our initial pilot program at High Country Fitness—partially attributed to CMU fitness instructor, Tammy West—the ASG was able to implement a second, larger pilot program with Gold's Gym.

Though the program only houses a small percentage of the Montrose Campus, only your support in this program will provide for future expansion. The pressure is on.

What is next for the Montrose Campus? President Tim Foster has asked us to work on a transportation proposal, connecting both the Montrose and Grand Junction campuses. I have contacted transit companies throughout the valley, and have not received an interest. Our next step will be to establish an in-house transportation system proposal; however, this will require more work.
